To Present Program

On May 31, David Kinder, Ph.D., professor of medicinal chemistry, will present a talk on medicinal plants and his recent research to visitors at the U.S. Park Service facility in Chaco Canyon, N.M.

Kinder, who has been doing ongoing field research in the Chaco Canyon and Mesa Verde areas of the Four Corners, has found a variety of potato along with wolfberry, a possible medicinal plant, in areas of ancient habitation. He says the plants are uniquely adapted to the desert conditions found in the Southwest.

He will leave for a new season of field research immediately following commencement.

Ohio Northern University's women's health class will celebrate National Women's Health Week by hosting women's health events in the Ada and Lima communities from May 10-16.

The class will host an event at ReStore in Ada to educate the public on Women's Health Week. Events are planned for the Lima-area for osteoporosis screening, blood pressure screening, prenatal nutrition and folate-rich food samples, and breast cancer awareness. These events will be held on Thursday, April 30, from 10 a.m.-4 p.m. at Rays Market, 890 S. Cable Road; Wednesday, May 6, from 10 a.m.-4 p.m. at Rays Marketplace, 2100 Harding Hwy; and Wednesday, May 13, from 10 a.m.-4 p.m. at Rays Clocktower, 927 North Cable Road.

During the week, students will also host events for nutrition information, skin cancer and sun protection, and preconception care for ONU female students, as well as bone density screening for ONU female faculty and staff.

The theme for National Women's Health Week 2009 is "It's Your Time."

National Women's Health Week kicks off on Mother's Day, May 10, and will be celebrated until May 16. National Women's Checkup Day, a day all women are urged to visit their doctor, will be held on May 11. Belck to Perform with Jazz Ensemble

Guest trumpeter Scott Belck will perform with ONU's Jazz Ensemble at the Freed Center for the Performing Arts on Tuesday, May 12, at 8 p.m.

Belck is an assistant professor of trumpet at Capital University's Conservatory of Music in Columbus, Ohio. He is a founding member of Tromba Mundi contemporary trumpet ensemble and has served as trumpet and cornet soloist with the Air Force Band of Flight in Dayton, Ohio.

He has performed as principal/lead trumpet with the Indianapolis Symphony, the Cincinnati Symphony, the Dayton Philharmonic Orchestra, the Lexington Philharmonic and the Richmond Symphony Orchestra.

Belck's playing credits include recordings with the Cincinnati Pops featuring the Manhattan Transfer and John Pizzarelli, the Glenn Miller Orchestra, the Van Dells, and the University of North Texas One O'clock Lab Band with whom he recorded four CDs.

He has performed lead trumpet for shows with a wide range of artists, including Aretha Franklin, Linda Ronstadt, John Lithgow, Donna Summer, Sandy Patti, Tommy Tune, Lou Rawls, Yes, Ben Vereen, Doc Severinsen, the Temptations, Olivia Newton-John and Neil Sedaka.

The ONU concert will pay tribute to some of the finest jazz musicians in history with selections from the Basie, Holman, Mintzer and Kenton bands. The ensemble is under the direction of Dr. David Kosmyrna, visiting assistant professor of music. ONU student conductors will assist Kosmyrna.
