



Dr. Roger Goldberg Takes Leave

Beginning Aug. 1, Dr. Roger H. Goldberg, associate vice president for academic affairs and professor of economics, will take a leave from his duties at Ohio Northern University and officially retire early next year.

Dr. Kendall L. Baker, ONU president, said, "Roger has contributed enormously to the welfare and development of ONU over many years. He is widely – and deservedly – respected by former students and colleagues alike. While I wish him the very best in retirement, there is no doubt that he will be greatly missed at ONU."

Goldberg received his BA (cum laude) from Cornell in 1967 and his M.A. from Indiana University in 1969. He joined Ohio Northern as an instructor in economics the same year. He was appointed assistant professor of economics in 1973 and associate professor in 1980. In 1981 he received his doctorate from Indiana University in Bloomington, Ind. He was named professor of economics in 1987.

In 1992 he moved into an administrative role with the University, taking the position of assistant vice president for academic affairs under the leadership of ONU President Debow Freed and Dr. Anne Lippert, vice president for academic affairs. In 1996 he became associate vice president for academic affairs.

Goldberg has been active in University, professional and community activities. In 1989-90 and 1990-91, he served as chair of the University Council. During his tenure as a faculty member, he chaired the budget and appropriations committee, academic affairs and personnel committees as well as serving on various other college and University committees. He is a past holder of the George W. Patton endowed chair.

He has served as president of the Ohio Association of Economists and Political Scientists and as a member of the National Tax Association, the American Economic Association and the Midwest Economics Association.

In the classroom, Goldberg was known as a demanding and effective professor. **Stephen A. Malbasa**, BA '75, now an ONU trustee and vice president of American Funds in Cleveland, Ohio, told *The Business Exchange*, "One of the things I appreciate the most about Dr. Goldberg is that he took a complex subject, economics, and helped me understand it, although it was very challenging. Once I got over the fear, he made complex subjects interesting and fun to learn."

Goldberg did the same both on and off campus, publishing articles on teaching economics and speaking about economic topics

to community organizations and alumni groups.

As associate vice president for academic affairs, Goldberg has been responsible for the University catalog, Honors Day, summer school, international-student matters and oversight of academic scheduling, assessment and faculty governance.

Goldberg said, "I've enjoyed my many years in teaching and administrative roles at the University, and most of all, I have fond memories of all the individuals who supported me in my various tasks."

Japanese Students on Campus

The Sakae Institute of Study Abroad is again bringing Japanese students to the Ohio Northern campus.

This year 31 Japanese students are on campus, ranging in age from 14 to 39. For the first time, four high school students, one freshman and three sophomores, are taking part. They will be attending U.S. boarding schools in the fall.

Seven will be starting graduate programs in the fall, and 20 will be entering undergraduate programs. Three will be enrolled at ONU: Yoji Sera, business management, Takeaki Murakami, business management, and Saori Yokoo, general studies with an interest in musical theatre management.

The Sakae program continues through Aug. 12 with students practicing their language skills, preparing for their U.S. classrooms and learning about American culture.

Veterans Can Attend ONU Tuition-free

Ohio Northern University has entered into the Yellow Ribbon Program, which allows eligible military veterans to attend ONU tuition-free for up to four years beginning in fall 2009.

The Yellow Ribbon GI Education Enhancement Program (Yellow Ribbon Program) is a provision of the Post-9/11 Veterans Education Assistance Act of 2008. As a participant in the program, Ohio Northern has promised to cover 50 percent of any tuition and fees that remain after Post-9/11 benefits have been used by an eligible service member. The U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs will match the contribution made by Ohio Northern, allowing eligible military veterans to attend ONU tuition-free.

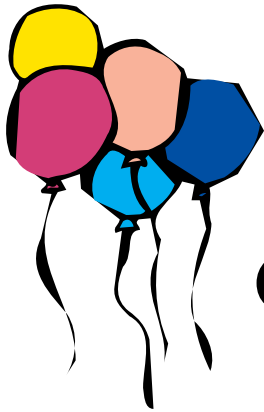
“Ohio Northern University is quite pleased to be able to support qualified veterans under this very special program,” said Karen Condeni, ONU vice president and dean of enrollment. “We look forward to seeing more of these students here and helping to build

their careers after military service.”

ONU’s pledge in the Yellow Ribbon Program extends to any eligible veteran enrolled in any academic program at ONU, with no limit on the number of participating veterans.

Eligibility includes those military veterans who have served at least 36 months of active duty after Sept. 10, 2001, as well as those veterans who have served 30 continuous days after Sept. 10, 2001, and were honorably discharged from active duty for a service-connected disability. Eligibility also extends to dependents who qualify for Transfer of Entitlement under the Post-9/11 GI Bill based on a veteran’s service under the eligibility criteria listed above.
