**Chapter Advisor Meeting Recap**

On Sunday, April 15, 2007, the Spring Quarter advisor meeting was held in the Affinity Commons Building. The meeting was hosted by Alice-Kay Hilderbrand, Chad Shepherd, and Jennifer Lambdin. There were 10 advisors in attendance with 7 of the 10 chapters being represented at the meeting. The agenda included the following: an update and discussion on the current state of ONU's Risk Management Policy, update on ONU's Phase II of the Housing Project, information on the status of the former Phi Kappa Theta house, updates on housing inspections, recruitment, councils, Greek Week and the Awards Banquet, as well as time for general discussion for the group. The consensus reached by all at the conclusion was for the next advisor meeting to take place during the fall quarter on a Sunday afternoon. The date of the fall meeting will be set over the summer. **Greek Perception Study**

In an attempt to gain information to help the community to plan and execute recruitment and retention efforts which will be more effective, two studies were completed during the spring quarter through Dr. Kleine's Marketing Research class regarding the perception of Greeks on campus from both students and faculty/staff. The results of the studies have been received in the Office of Greek Life and are being reviewed at this time. Additional information regarding the studies will be available in the summer.

## Risk Management Update

In January 2006 ONU's Greek Leaders met to discuss the current Greek Risk Management Policy. This 'Greek Summit' led to the formation of a Risk Management Task Force composed of fraternity men and sorority women whose goal was to develop a legal and effective Risk Management Policy that could be followed and enforced by the Greek community. This task proved to be very challenging and little accomplished by the end of the 2005-06 academic year. However, during 2006-07, the Interfraternity Council picked-up where the Task Force left off. After several trials and errors, a Fraternity Risk Management Policy is nearly complete. The main purpose of the policy is to provide guidelines and direction for Fraternity Registered Events (events with alcohol). The Greek Life Office is currently working with ONU's legal firm to finalize the document hoped for implementation for fall quarter 2007-08.

## Recruitment

Plans for the upcoming fall recruitment have been underway for many months! Below is a brief listing of the activities currently planned.

- **Summer Orientation Sessions**—As with last year, a Greek Information Session will be held during each of the summer orientation programs. Each session will include a Greek man and woman, as well as Office staff, to talk about Greek life at Northern. The video, which was created last summer, also will be played during these sessions.
- **Freshmen Move-In**—The Greek community will be helping with move-in for the new students. Each chapter will have 20 volunteers working during the day as well as council officers and Recruitment Counselors, to help the new students and families while promoting the positive aspects of Greek life.
- **Play Fair**—Again this year, the Greek community will have the opportunity to facilitate the main activity on the first evening of Fall Orientation for New Students. 48 Greek students will represent the community in this fun and interactive activity.
- **Greekapalooza**—Students from the councils and Residence Life already have already been working on the planning for this event; it will be held on the Sunday evening of opening weekend. The event will include inflatables, food, prizes, games, and a dunk tank. All will provide opportunities for the Greek community to get to know the new students.
- **Welcome Fest**—Both councils will have a table at this event during opening weekend. New students will have an opportunity to interact with Greek representatives while learning more about the Greek community.
- **Information Nights**—Each of the councils also will host an informational night during September to introduce its' recruitment events and provide additional information about Greek life at Northern.
- **Additional Events**—The schedule for all of the recruitment events is included at the end of this newsletter.

## House Inspections

- On Tuesday, April 3, a meeting was held for representatives from all chapters to discuss the Life Safety Inspection process for Greek housing. The Office was represented with attendance by Chad and Jennifer. Representatives were present from all of the chapters. At the conclusion of the meeting, chapters divided up into their respective groups (i.e. renters, owners, and Affinity Village) in order to discuss relevant issues.
- At the meeting several updates were discussed. The updated policy regarding actions that will be taken upon a chapter failing an inspection were reviewed and copies distributed to all present. In addition, it was noted at the meeting that copies of all documentation are required to be turned in prior to the actual date of the inspection.
- Chapter house inspections were completed the week of May 7, 2007.
- The Spring quarter inspections were graded for all in accordance with the previously created forms: renters, owners, and Affinity Village groups.
- For the Spring Quarter inspections, 9 of 10 chapters passed the overall inspection. Results were sent electronically to chapter leadership, advisors, and housing corporations the week of May 14, 2007.
- Summer inspections will be held the week of August 6, 2007. More specific information will be sent to presidents and advisors in the summer.
